On June 11, 2018, the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) received a letter dated June 5, 2018 from a group purporting to represent your defense fund. The letter, a copy of which is enclosed, did not provide any contact information beyond an email address and a website address. Without additional information, the OIG has no way to verify that the group is a legitimate entity associated with you. As a result, the OIG is sending you its response to the group's letter.

We understand that your matter with the Department of Commerce is still being actively litigated. As a general practice, the OIG does not open an investigation or a review into matters that are the subject of active litigation. Once the litigation concludes, the OIG can revisit requests related to your matter and determine which area may be appropriate for OIG work.
